

History of the Old Post Office



A handsome example of Depression-era architecture, the Gretna Post Office on Huey P. Long Avenue and 4th Street was constructed in 1936, after its relocation from an old building at 619 Second Street. The U.S. Post Office Department renovated and extended the building in 1963, making it more than twice its original size. It served the community until 2003, when the United States Postal Service closed the office and planned to sell the building. In anticipation of preserving and restoring the building as a historic landmark, the City Council approved its purchase by the City of Gretna on October 10, 2006, with financial assistance provided by Jefferson Parish. Exterior restoration was completed in 2008, and all interior renovations needed to convert the building into a cultural center for the arts were finished in 2016.
